- **Ideas** describe original thinking, promising practices or emerging ways of how to improve care.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

This is your chance to share your project or idea with people who are passionate about improving the landscape of HIV-STBBI's in Manitoba and beyond! We're accepting abstracts for rapid fire presentations for our first face-to-face event since 2020!

The HIV-STBBI landscape is highly complex. As a result, the MB HIV-STBBI Collective Impact Network was formed in 2016 to work collectively to tackle systems change. This is our 15th large event! With the recent dire report from the [MB HIV Program and their calls to action](#) we are moved as a Network to show how our work will create change. Our theme ***"Taking Action to Disrupt the HIV-STBBI Status Quo"*** is meant to elevate how our work will disrupt the current dire trends.

Call for abstracts will close February 28th, 2023

Rapid Fire Presentations

Engage with participants using slides, video or other media in a 10-minute oral presentation that will be scheduled as part of the main Forum programming. Your presentation will be followed by an eight-minute Q&A period, during which you're welcome to ask the audience questions for discussion as well.

This presentation format is limited to a maximum of three presenters for inclusion in event materials and participation in the live presentation itself. We will also require the following key information as part of your submission:

Abstracts can be submitted under one of two categories, depending on the stage of your work:

- **Outcomes** are research projects and other initiatives underway or complete with demonstrated results and lessons that can be shared. Projects do not have to be considered a success – failures also provide valuable learning opportunities!

- **Ideas** describe original thinking, promising practices or emerging ways of how to improve care that are too young to have results. You can seek input, inspiration, collaboration and spark action at an early stage.

Abstracts

In 300 words or fewer, tell us about any topic related to tackling HIV-STBBI's and improving the system of care for people and those working in the system.

You can submit as many abstracts as you'd like by completing an online submission form for each. All submissions will be notified of the status of their abstract by the end of March.

Abstracts must be written in English. Please proofread your abstract for spelling and grammatical errors and avoid the use of jargon or acronyms that may not be commonly recognized. We ask that you please review the remaining submission guidelines prior to submitting your abstract.

Main Presenter/Contact

At this stage in the process, we only require a single contact for your abstract. This individual will be the one informed of the status of your submission and communicated with if we need any additional information. This should be the person that ultimately submits the abstract.

Authors

Other author names, titles

Presentation Title

You will need to include a title for your abstract – this is how your abstract will be listed in all program materials. As mentioned, we ask that you refrain from using jargon or acronyms that may not be commonly recognized.

Presentation Type:

Outcome or Idea : Choose one depending on the stage of your work

Abstract Details

Provide your Abstract for a **Rapid Fire Presentation**: (no more than 300 words). Suggested Headings for **Outcome Abstract**: Background, Methods, Findings, Impact, Lessons Learned/Recommendations. Suggested Headings for **Idea Abstract**: My Idea, Why this is important, What I am looking for by presenting this

Keywords

Three keywords are required per abstract. These help us when building the program to ensure abstracts on similar topics are grouped together in our rapid fire sessions. They are also used by participants when selecting the sessions they want to attend.

Briefly describe how this work is related to the CINetwork's focus of changing systems: changing mindsets, changing policies, changing practices, changing workflows, changing power dynamics, understanding gaps.
